

## Contactless delivery | Drop-off permission

For business customers as well

By issuing a drop-off permission, you enable us to deliver your parcel without confirmation of receipt.

All you have to do is inform us about your desired drop-off location - for example in the garage or on the patio. The address given has to match the recipient's address.

It's as easy as that:

- 1. Please fill in the form completely and sign it
- 2. Attach the form clearly visible to the house/apartment door/doorbell For a permanent drop-off permission: Please give the form to the driver

or send it via e-mail.

**Important**: It is **not possible** to obtain a drop-off permission if your shipper has booked one of these services: AddresseeOnly**Service** · Cash**Service** · Exchange**Service** · Pick&Return**Service** · Pick&Ship**Service** · HazardousGoods**Service** · LimitedQuantities**Services**
